

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome back to school! I hope you all had a fun and relaxing summer. I am excited to be returning as your School Nurse. My goal is to have a safe and healthy environment for learning and look forward to working with you and your child in the coming year.



Sometimes it is hard to decide if your child needs to stay home or can go to school. To help give you some guidelines, please refer to the link *When Should I Keep My Child Home* on the Shelton View website. If you are still not sure if your child should come to school, please give me a call. There is also additional information on my Health Room website that can be accessed at: http://sheltonview.nsd.org

If your child needs to take medication at school (prescription and/or over the counter) you may obtain the Medication Authorization Forms from me in the Health Room (or on the website above). On the back of the Medication Authorization Form is NSD's Medication at School Policy, which reflects WA State law.

Please do not send any medication to school without the proper authorization — it cannot be given.

If your child takes regular medication at home that should not be interrupted (i.e. medication for a seizure disorder) I strongly encourage you to obtain the necessary authorization and keep a 3-day supply of medication at school in case of an emergency — such as an earthquake.

State law requires that a child with a life-threatening condition have medication or treatment orders in place on or before their first day of school. As a result, students with severe asthma, allergies that require epinephrine, diabetes or any other condition considered life threatening will need to have medication/treatment orders signed and in place at school on or before the first day of attendance.

VISION AND HEARING SCREENING

Each year in Northshore schools, students in grades Kindergarten, 1, 2, 3, 5, and 7 receive hearing and vision screenings. We are currently scheduled for vision and hearing screenings on Friday, October 12, 2018. If you would like to exempt your child from either of these health screenings, please contact me.

It is important to understand that these are basic screenings, and are designed to identify students who may require further testing. They are not intended to replace regular exams by qualified health care providers. A student who does not pass any screening will be rechecked in a few weeks, and you will be notified only if there are concerns after the second screening.

Vision screening uses the PlusOptix. The PlusOptix is an autorefractor that takes a measurement of the refraction of the eyes. The results give a baseline refraction measurement. The illumination technique used by PlusOptix, is totally harmless to the child's eyes. If your child wears glasses or contact lenses for distance or near vision, please be sure they have them on the screening day.

If your child has a hearing loss and is being followed by a healthcare provider or specialist and you do not wish for them to participate in the screening, please let the school nurse know. If you have concerns about hearing loss and school accommodations, contact your student's teacher or the school nurse. If you would like to volunteer for the screening day, please contact me.

I'm looking forward to a great year ahead! As always, please contact me if you have any questions or concerns about your child's health.
